## What has each class been learning about this week?

<u>EYFS-</u> In English, we have been reading the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. We have been putting the story back in order and writing labels. In maths, we have been learning all about patterns. We have made our own repeated pattern caterpillars and symmetrical butterflies.

<u>Year 1-</u> In English we have been writing a postcard from Sunny. In Maths, we have been grouping amounts into 2s, 5s and 10s and doubling.

<u>Year 2-</u> In maths we have been exploring what fractions are and have been finding a half of shapes and numbers. In English, we have been improving our emotion vocabulary and have written some great emotional speeches.

<u>Year 3-</u> In English this week, we have been creating a description of King Tutankhamen's funeral precession based on our book The Gold in the Grave. In maths, we have been finding and recognising halves, quarters and thirds.

<u>Year 4-</u> In English this week, we have been writing a formal letter of complaint to Jub about the missing happy endings. In Maths, we have been finding factor pairs and efficient methods of multiplication.

<u>Year 5-</u> In English this week, we have been exploring the characters from 'Holes' and have written some brilliant character descriptions. In Maths, we have been learning about decimal numbers.

<u>Year 6-</u> In English, Y6 have been learning how to build tension and suspense in their writing. In Maths, they have focussed on rounding decimals to varying degrees, as well as interpreting negative numbers in context.
