What has each class been learning about this week?

<u>Nursery-</u>In English, we have been reading the story 'From head to toe'. We have had lots of fun joining in with the words and actions. In our number work, we have been counting actions and matching objects to numbers.

<u>Reception</u> – In English, we have been reading the story 'Leafman'. We have made our own leaf men and written labels and sentences using our phonics. In Maths, we have been learning numbers 4 and 5 and finding different ways to make both numbers.

<u>Year 1-</u> In English, we have been writing a setting description to describe The Great Fire of London. In Maths, we have been finding the difference between two numbers and comparing them.

<u>Year 2-</u> This week, Year 2 have created marvellous moon books to share their super space knowledge! In Maths, we have been finding the total of different coins. In DT, we have designed moon buggies and are starting to collect equipment ready to make them!

<u>Year 3-</u> This week Year 3 have been creating character descriptions and describing the setting of our new story, 'The Stone Age Boy'. In maths, we have been learning how to make equal groups and arrays.

<u>Year 4-</u> This week Year 4 have been multiplying and dividing in Maths. In English we have been reading 'Gregory the Greenfield Giant'. We have acted out the story, drawn story maps and looked at personification. In Topic we have been labelling counties and regions in the UK.

<u>Year 5-</u> This week in English, we have been reading a book called 'The Golden Horsemen of Baghdad'. We have been writing character descriptions. In Maths, we have been learning how to divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1,000.

<u>Year 6-</u> This week Year 6 have been reading and watching clips from 'The Boy in Striped Pyjamas'. After studying this book, we have tried to understand how the characters might have felt and re-created what they may have said to each other. Top tips

Your kids need help brushing their teeth until they are at least seven years old.

Spit, don't rinse

When we brush, our toothpaste builds a protective layer of fluoride around our teeth. If you rinse your mouth with water, you wash it all away. Spitting will do just fine.

Ask your dentist about fluoride varnish to make your child's teeth stronger. All children over 3 years can have this and your dentist may recommend it for some children under at risk of tooth decay too.
