What has each class been learning about this week?

- <u>EYFS-</u> This week, Nursery have been reading the story 'Cats Cook Book'. In maths we have been learning to 'Subitise'. Reception have been reading the book 'Ketchup On Your Cornflakes'. We have been thinking about the different foods that we like. In maths, we have been learning all about Number Bonds to 5.
- <u>Year 1-</u> This week we have been writing our own rhyme in English, inspired by 'Pussy cat pussy cat, where have you been?' In Maths, we have been working on our place value to 50, by counting more and less of amounts and numbers.
- <u>Year 2-</u> This week, Year 2 have been writing and performing their own monster poems using rhyming words and similes. In Maths, we have been learning about shape and have made terrific 2D shape patterns!
- <u>Year 3-</u> This week in English, Year 3 have been writing and performing their own Kenning poems to the rest of the class. In maths, we have been practicing our multiplication and division skills and applying our knowledge of money to giving change.
- <u>Year 4-</u> This week Year 4 have been looking at the poem 'I am a Roman Soldier'. We have looked at using determiners within the stanzas. We then wrote our own stanza for the poem. In Maths we have been adding and subtracting fractions.
- <u>Year 5-</u> This week in English, we have been writing character descriptions based on the book The polar bear explorers club. In Maths, we have been learning about decimals and how to order, compare and round decimals.
- <u>Year 6-</u> This week year 6 have been writing a play script in English based on the book The Explorer. We have really enjoyed being creative and writing dialogue which matches the character's personality. In maths we have been leaning about statistics and how to interpret bar charts and line graphs.
