Remote learning packs

As you know, due to the current circumstances, there may be times throughout this school year when your child has to stay at home to self-isolate. When this happens, your child's class teacher will set home learning activities on Purple Mash. Also, your child will receive weekly homework on Purple Mash (even when they are in school) so that they are used to the activities and how to complete tasks.

Although most of the activities can be completed on the computer or tablet, sometimes the teacher might want your child to complete something on paper or to practise a new skill away from a machine.

From December 2020, you can purchase a Remote Learning Pack through ParentPay for just £2.50. All children will need this pack to complete their learning.

The pack will contain the same quality resources your child is used to using at school and includes:

- A pencil
- A ruler
- A sharpener
- An eraser
- A pack of crayons
- A jotter book
- Dice
- A set of counters
- A dry wipe board
- A dry wipe pen
- A card describing ideas and further resources you can access from home

What has each class been learning about this week?

<u>EYFS-</u> Nursery have been reading the story 'From Head to Toe' and learning about counting and matching numbers. Reception have read the story 'The Gruffalo' and have been learning how to describe a character. In maths, we have been learning how to add two groups together.

<u>Year 1-</u> In English we have been writing an alternative ending to our story Dipsy the Dinosaur Firefighter. In Maths, we have been partitioning numbers to 20.

<u>Year 2-</u> We have been writing diaries using the language of emotions and personal pronouns I, my and me. In maths we have started a new topic of money and have recognising coins and their values.

<u>Year 3-</u> In English, we have been learning all about how Stonehenge was created and have created some excellent drama and found lots of amazing facts. In Maths we have been learning about dividing by 4 and 8.

<u>Year 4-</u> In English, we have been drafting a persuasive leaflet and using our ICT skills to start to produce it on the computers. In Maths we have been looking at finding the perimeters of rectilinear shapes.

<u>Year 5-</u> In English, we have been retelling the ancient story of Little Prince using direct speech. In Maths, we have been learning about squared and cube numbers.

<u>Year 6-</u> In English, Year 6 have written a narrative set during The Blitz. Maths this week has been spent calculating with mixed numbers, as well as multiplying fractions.
